It turned out that many of our members that are receiving little or no income while on STRIKE will qualify for retroactive to May 1st coverage.

Please look at the information below and determine if this will work out for you and your family. As Verizon continues to kick our members and their families to the curb in favor of scab labor it looks like another Union family has stepped up. In case anyone does not understand, Verizon has purposely slowed the process for all of those applying for COBRA, they have pushed the boundries to purposely delay and try to create hardships on our members and their families. It really is a damn shame and I will never look at this managemt structure the same. We have seen true evil in the STRIKE of 2016.

For those of you that have signed up for the bus trip to the DC rally on Thursday, the bus will be leaving Security and route 70 local park and ride at 12:30 and then White Marsh park and ride at 1:30p.m. The return trip details will be provided on the buis as well as lunch type meal for the return trip.
